Programs: **Medical Assistant:** Work alongside doctors, nurses, & other professionals, providing direct patient care in a variety of facilities. Students are taught clinical & clerical skills such as EKGs, injections, phlebotomy, vital signs, various lab tests, first aid, CPR, computer & other front desk duties.

Psychiatric Assistant: Assist in the professional care & treatment to the mentally ill, developmentally disabled, and clients in recovery for addictions. Students are taught developmental psychology, psychiatric diseases, disorders, & treatment. The Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor curriculum is included. Students will also learn first aid, CPR, and Aggressive Patient Management.

Medical Office Assistant: A six month course focusing on the administrative skills used in most health care facilities. Students will learn computer skills, processing insurance, coding & billing, medical collections, and front office management procedures.

Patient Care Technician: A six month course that prepares the graduate to work in hospitals, long-term care, senior & rehabilitative medicine facilities. Includes CNA training and prepares student for state exams. In addition to direct patient care students are taught how to perform EKGs & phlebotomy.

How to apply for acceptance: A personal interview and tour of the school is required prior to enrollment. A prospective student will receive information necessary to make an intelligent decision regarding their career choice. An application must be submitted to the school director for acceptance.
